Option 1: School visit to the Scottish Owl Centre

Approx 10.00am Arrive and have snack (if desired) in our under cover picnic area. (Seats 48 children but Flying Arena available for larger groups.)

- **10.30am** 'Hoot's for Dinner' presentation: a lucky dip game with 2 owls to learn about contrasting owl diets, habitats and hunting techniques.
- **10.45am** Look around the Centre (approx. 45 mins): we can provide quiz sheets for children to complete on their way round. (Requires reading but not writing.)
- **11.30am(April-Aug) or 12.30pm(Sept-March)** Flying Display (approx. 30 minutes) in our indoor Flying Arena. Age-appropriate and relevant to your current topic if required.
- 12.00(April to Aug) or 11.45am(Sept-March) Lunch in our under cover picnic area.
- **1.00pm** Finish looking round, play on the big owl chute and/or visit the gift the shop. (Suggest £1 £5 pocket money.)
- **1.30-2pm** Home-time or finish up at the large adventure playground within Polkemmet Country Park.
- N.B. The **toilets** are at the front of the main building before you come into the Owl Centre.

Quiz Sheets

Our quiz sheets (Prof. Hoot's Tough Test and Quick Quiz) are designed to be completed during the visit to ensure that the children visit all the main areas of the Centre and read the most important information. They have to go to the relevant area, find the answer and use the hole punch there to mark the correct box. Areas include the Wee Owl World, Boreal Boulevard, North Pole, African Avenue, Prof. Hoot's Owl School, Rainforest Realm.

Activity Sheets

We can provide age-appropriate activity sheets for you to copy and use in class either before or after your visit.

Option 2: Visit with owls to your school

We can bring two owls of contrasting size to your classroom or assembly hall for up to an hour and give an interactive presentation on the uniqueness of owls, as well as our 'Hoot's for Dinner?' game about owl diet. We can finish up with a time for questions and the teacher or other chosen adult can hold an owl for a photo. We are able to travel up to 40 miles from the Scottish Owl Centre at EH47 OAD.
